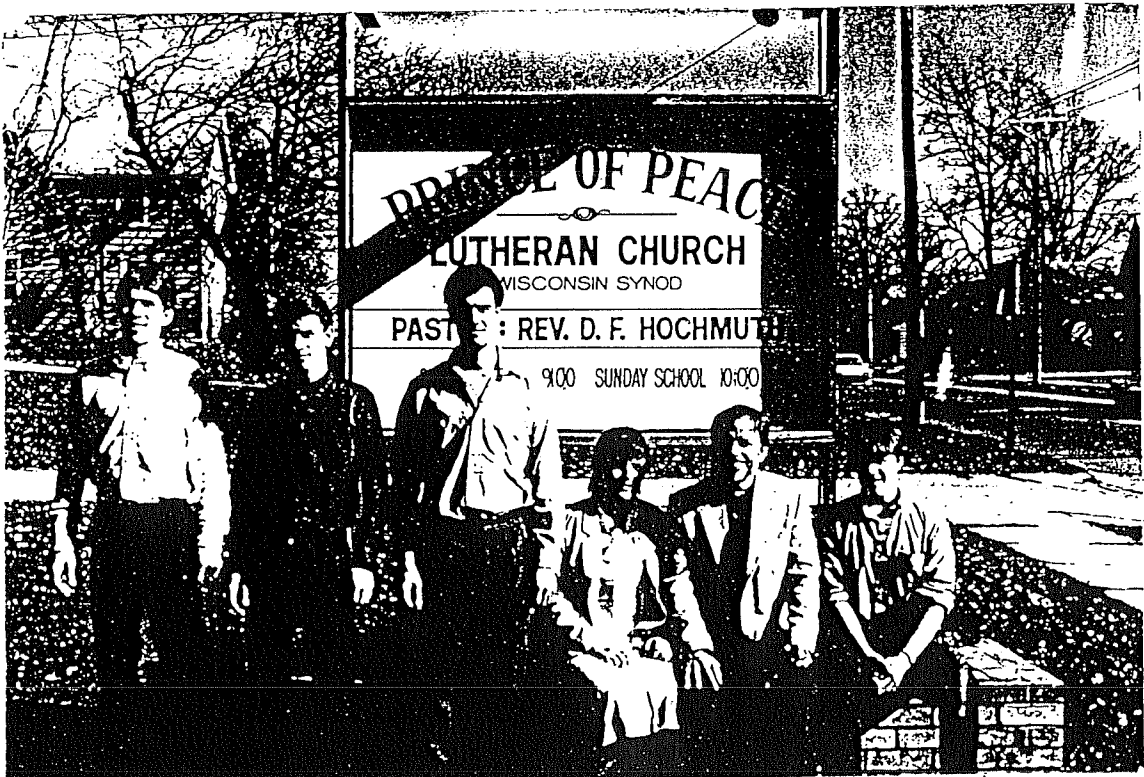
MASON CITY— The Rev. Donald F. Hochmuth, of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, has accepted a call to serve two Lutheran congregations in the St. Paul, Minn., area. The two congregations have taken initial steps on a program of merger and relocation.

Pastor Hochmuth was ordained into the ministry and installed as pastor of the former Gethsemane Lutheran Church here on July 15, 1973. In 1976 he accepted a call to serve the former Central Heights Lutheran Church as an additional charge.

In 1981 the Gethsemane and Central Heights congregations merged to form Grace Lutheran Church. The merger was made official in a worship service and mortgage burning on May 1 of this year.

Pastor Hochmuth has conducted worship service over 14 years at the Grand Center facility and at the Shepherd Center Center. He has been serving on the board of directors of both Birthright and Cerro Gordo County Right to Life Committee.

Pastor Hochmuth will deliver his farewell sermon here at 9 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 3. An open house will be held from 2 to 4 p.m. The public is welcome. Prince of Peace Lutheran Church is located at 670 12th NE.

MASON CITY — Mrs. Walter Dirksen, a member of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, 670 12th NE, attended the 23rd annual convention of the Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) in Appleton, Wis., June 27-28. She was a voting delegate.

Prince of Peace Lutheran participates in the Hiawatha Valley Circuit of LWMS.

The LWMS, a society of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS), was organized in 1964 to increase interest in and support of WELS mission endeavors.

Outside the United States, the WELS supports sister mission

churches in Zambia, Malawi, United Republic of Cameroon, Nigeria, Columbia, Brazil, Sweden, Puerto Rico, Mexico, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Indonesia and India. There also are 291 mission congregations in the 50 states and Canada.

Friday evening speakers included the Rev. Paul Kelm, executive secretary, the Board for Evangelism, and the Rev. Richard Lauersdorf, chairman of the Interim Committee for Brazil. Saturday speakers included the Rev. Duane Tomhave, executive secretary, Board for Home Missions; the Rev. David Haberkorn, missionary in Japan, and the Rev.

Charles Flunker, missionary in Puerto Rico.

The Rev. Norman Berg, executive secretary, Board for Home Missions; the Rev. Harold Hagedorn, associate executive secretary, Board of Home Missions, and the Rev. William Brassow, mission explorer, San Antonio, Texas, also addressed the convention.

Mission projects selected for national support during the 1986-87 year were the Hong Kong Study Center and the Home Missions Equipment Fund. The service offering was given to the ongoing language training programs of missionaries in Brazil.

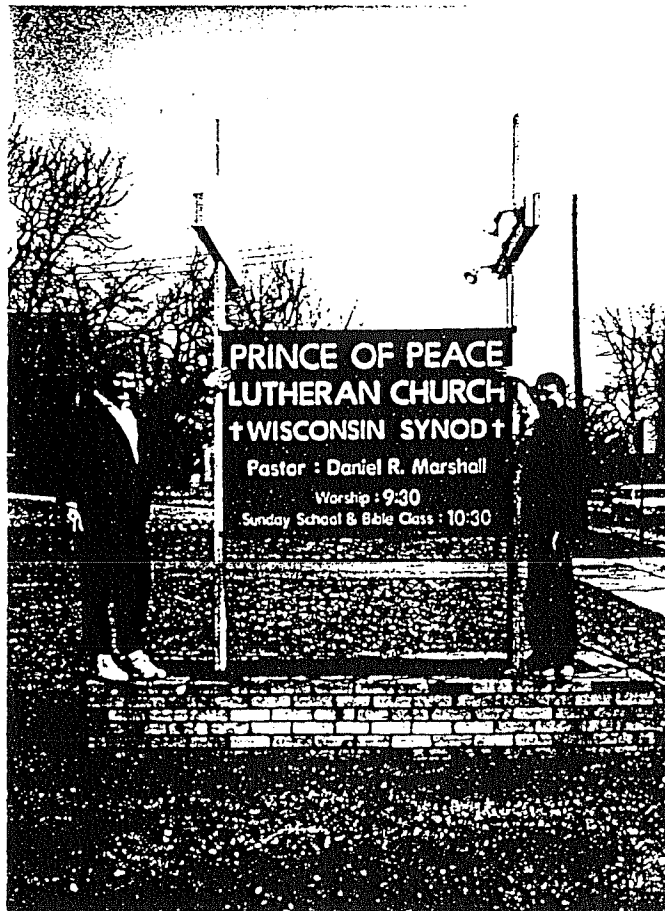

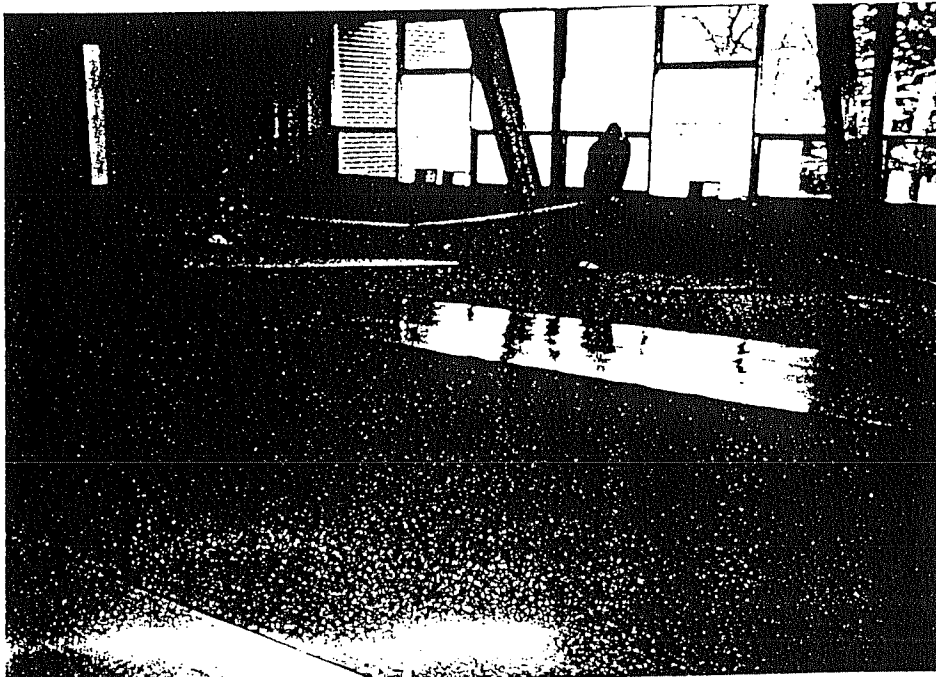
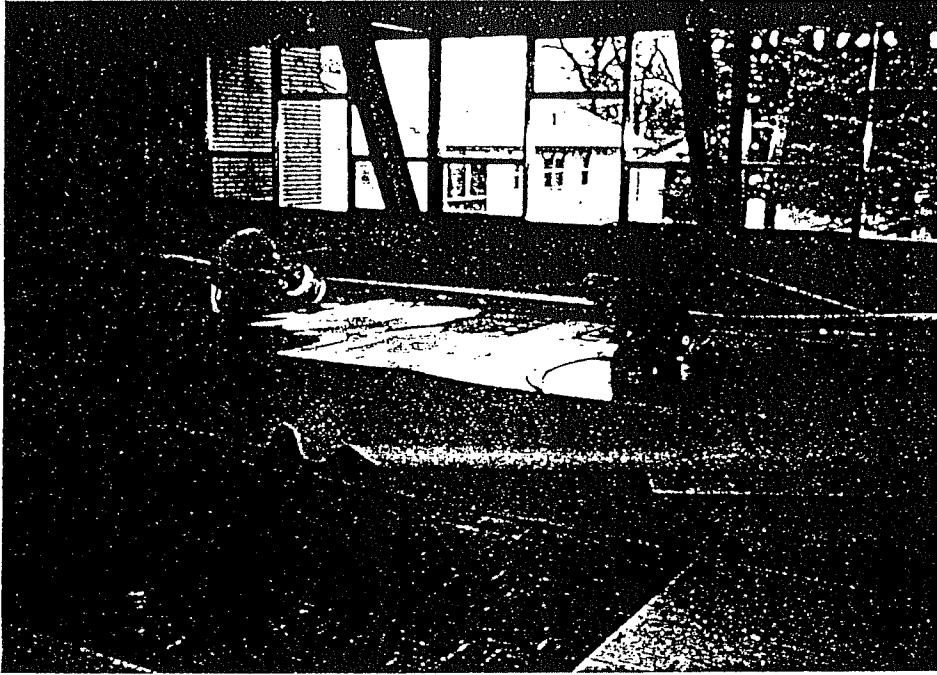


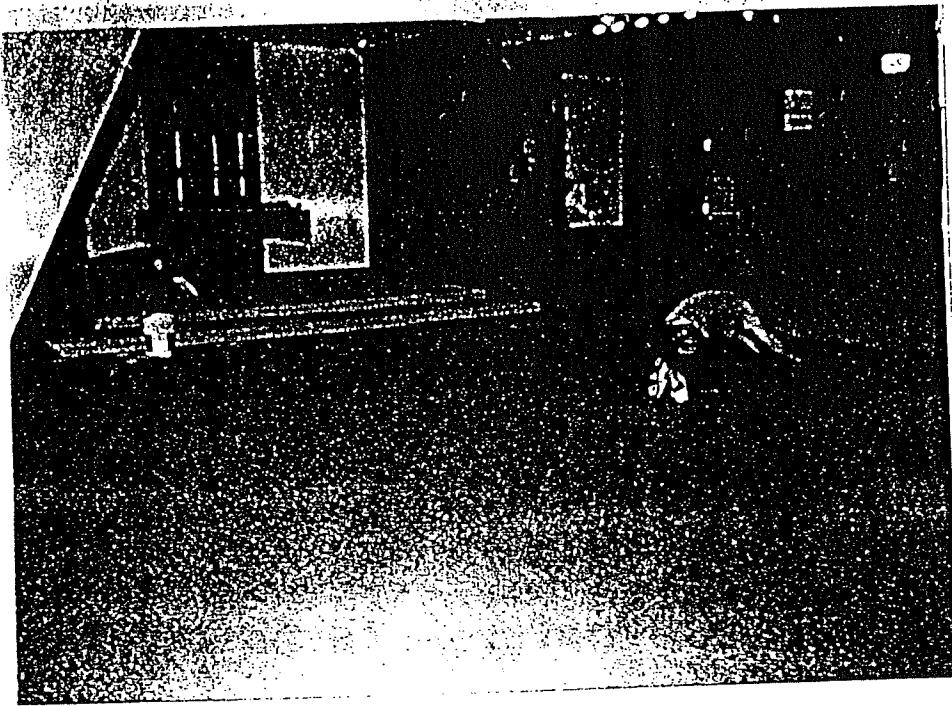

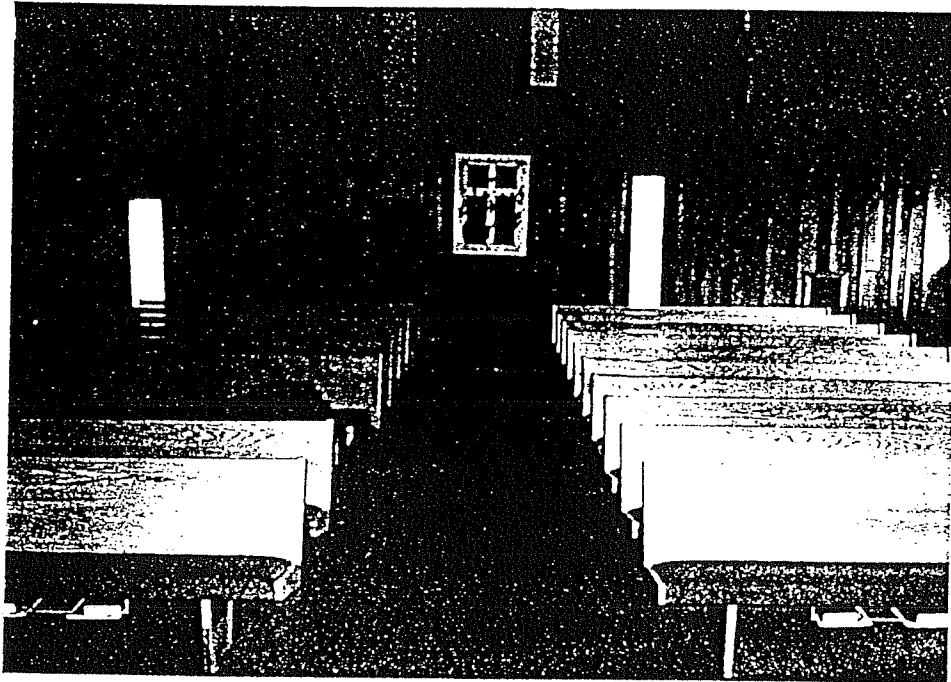

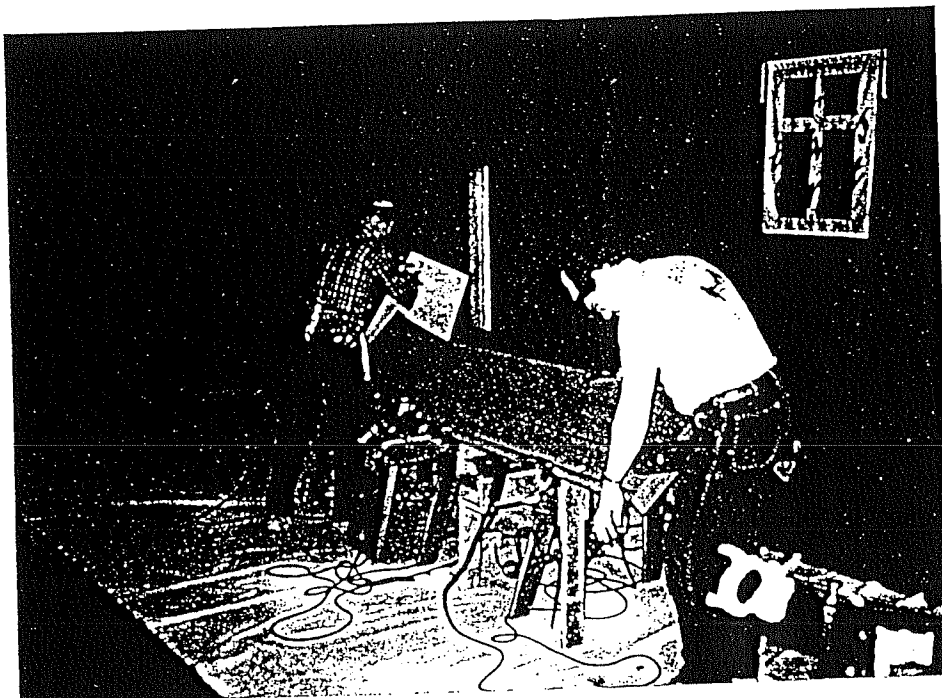

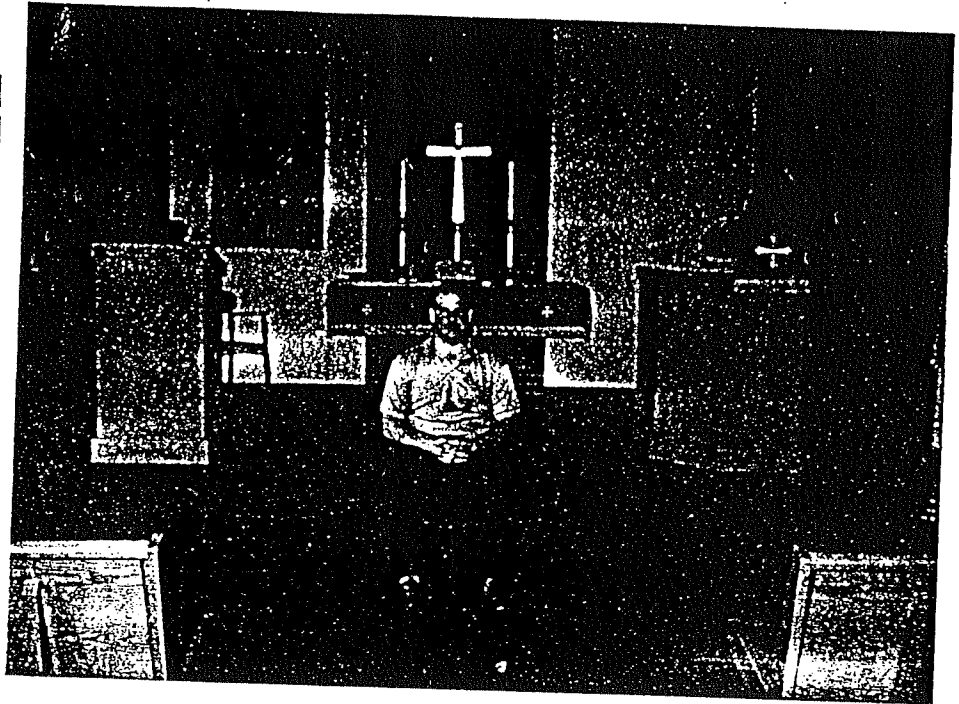

lowing the service.

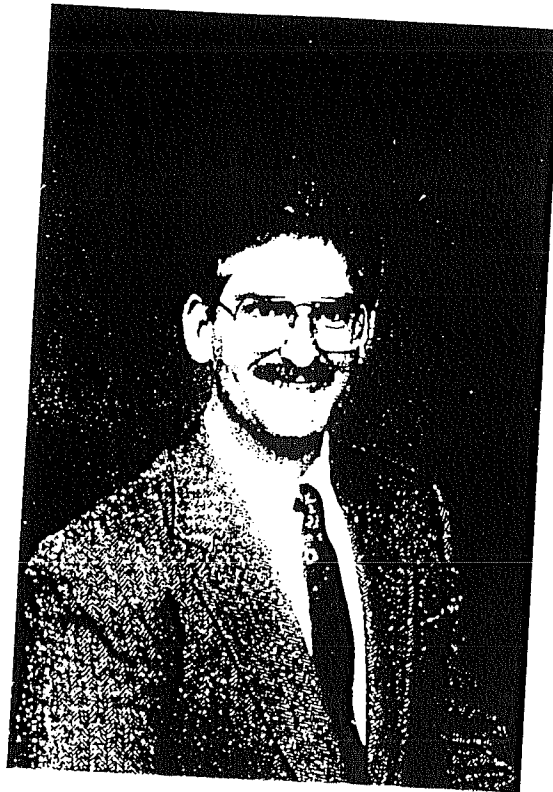

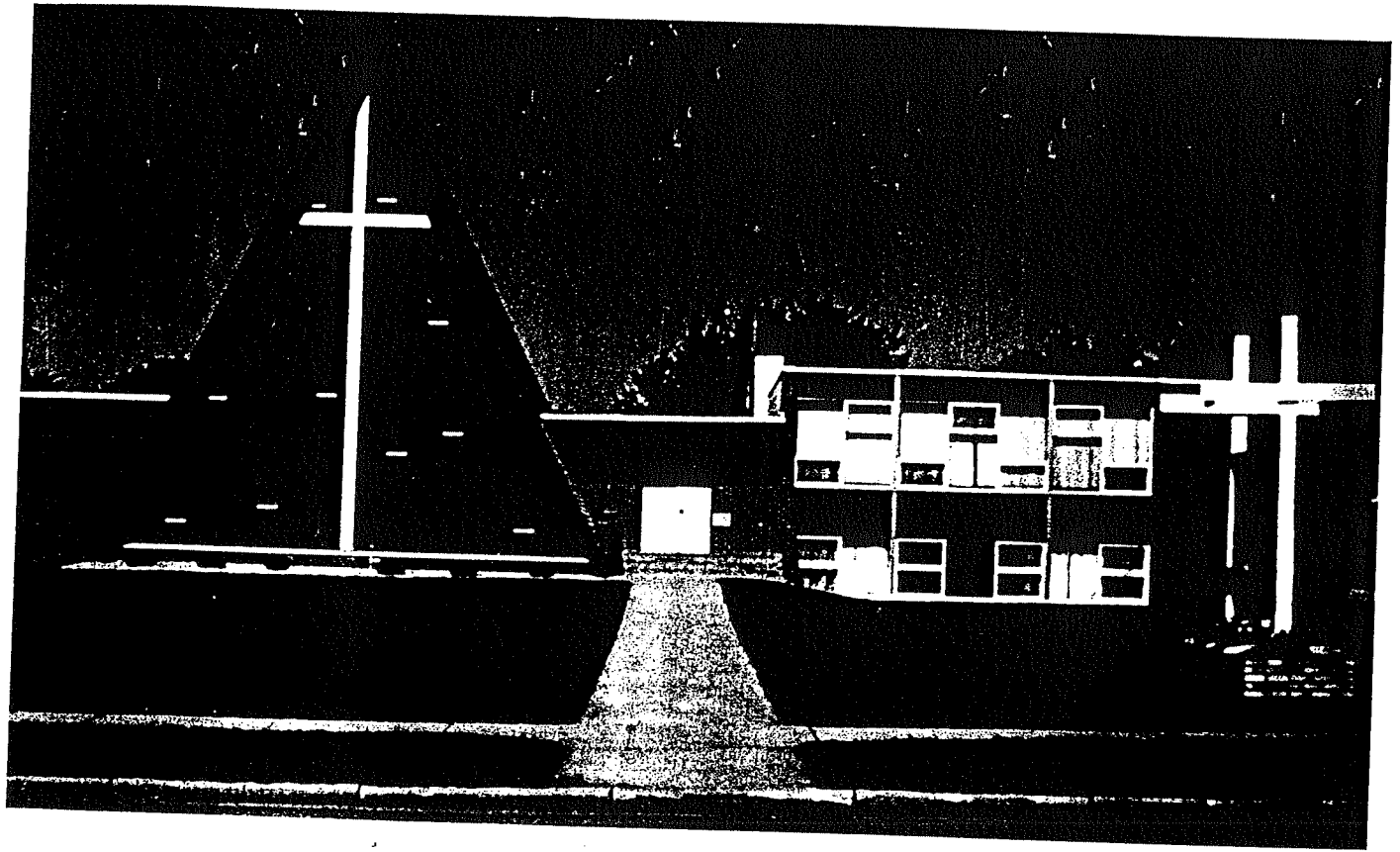
Pastor Aufdemberges' home town is originally

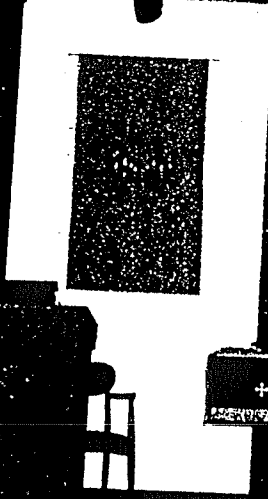
